If you do paper copies you will need to take a picture with your iPad and upload the pictures of **all** the problems to Schoology. If you use OneNote, you can export your completed homework directly to Schoology.

Due Dates: Every assignment will have a due date the day after it is assigned at Midnight. What if you miss the due date? That is okay. I understand sometimes you won't have time after school to get to all your homework done or you will have questions. I will still accept assignments up to the day of the test. This doesn't mean wait till the night before the test to complete your homework, that wouldn't benefit you. The sooner you turn in your homework the sooner I can grade it and give you feedback. Feedback is what you need to improve your math skills and will help you be successful in the class.

Additional Information

Grades: The time to work on improving your grade is during class throughout the quarter and semester. The last week of the quarter is not the time to come and ask how to fix your grade.
