

Dear AP Student,

Thank you for registering for the AP exams! You are required to follow the policies of both the College Board and Advanced Placement tests, as well as school-related testing policies. Any misconduct will be reported and may require your AP exam to be voided with no refund. Be sure to review the most recent issue of the Bulletin for AP Students and Parents. If you have any questions or concerns, please visit with your school counselor.

You should bring the following items to the testing room on exam day:

- A photo ID (student ID, driver's licensed, etc.)
- Two or three sharpened #2 pencils with erasers (no mechanical pencils or separate erasers are allowed)
- Two blue or black ink pens
- A calculator – only if you are taking the AP Calculus, AP Chemistry, AP Physics, or AP Statistics exam (please review the College Board's [calculator policy](#) for your specific exam)
- A ruler – only if you are taking AP Physics exams (no protractors are allowed)

You should not bring the following items:

- Electronics (phones, music players, computers, tablets, camera, Apple watches, or any other devices that can access the internet)
- Books, dictionaries, mechanical pencils, notes, highlighters, erasers, compasses, protractors, etc.
- Scratch paper
- Calculators (unless you are taking one of the examinations mentioned above)
- Watches that beep or have alarms
- Food and drinks
  - You are allowed to bring a snack and beverage for your 10 minute test break. However, items will not be permitted to be consumed in the test room. Your test proctor will have a spot for storing your snacks until break time.

You are required to arrive no later than 15 minutes prior to the test start time (7:45AM for morning tests, 11:45AM for afternoon tests). Students are not dismissed until an exam has officially ended. You will not be permitted to leave early; if you do, your test is void and you will not receive a refund.

It is advisable to wear layers in case the room temperature is warm or cool.
