School and Community

Sheyenenne High School, located in West Fargo, ND, is a comprehensive public high school enrolling almost 1,500 students in grades 9-12. The school opened in the fall of 2007 as a Ninth Grade Center. In the 2013-2014 school year, Sheyenenne Ninth Grade Center started its transition to the second high school in the district, Sheyenenne High School, by adding sophomores within the set boundary lines. In the 2014-2015 school year, Sheyenenne High School housed all freshmen in the district and all sophomores and juniors who lived within the boundary lines. The 2015-2016 school year was the first year that Sheyenenne High School housed 9-12 graders within its boundary lines and had their first graduating class. In the fall of 2021, West Fargo Public Schools opened its third high school in the district, Horace High School.

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Curriculum

Sheyenenne High School is organized on a 1-8 period day, with each period lasting 45 minutes. Students at Sheyenenne High School attend classes either periods 1-7 or 2-8. Our school calendar is on a semester schedule and each period of an instruction-based course is worth .50 credit. Students can potentially earn 7.5 credits per academic year (this includes Advisory). Students at Sheyenenne High School must earn a total of 23 credits to graduate; of those 23 credits they must be dispersed in the following manner: 4.0 credits of English, 3.5 credits of Social Studies, 3.0 credits of Math, 3.0 credits of Science, .50 credit of Health, 1.5 credits of Physical Education, 4.5 credits of Electives and 3.5 credits of Electives specifically in the areas of Fine Arts, Foreign Language or Career and Technical Education.

Sheyenenne High School includes or will include the following AP courses for enrollment: AP Biology, AP Language and Composition, AP Literature and Composition, AP Calculus, AP Physics, AP Chemistry, AP US History, AP US Government, AP French V, AP Economics, AP European History, AP Human Geography, AP Psychology

Sheyenenne High School also offers or will offer the following Dual Credit (college credit) courses for enrollment:

College Algebra, Fundamentals of Public Speaking, Intro to Teaching, Teaching Field Experience, Educating the Exceptional Student (Peer to Peer 2), Medical Terminology, Statistics, Prevention and Care of Athletic Injuries, History of Rock and Roll, Advanced Health and Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS).

All credits awarded through the Dual Credit program are from North Dakota State College of Science in Wahpeton, ND or Valley City State University in Valley City, ND.

Dual Credit and AP classes are weighted.
